



Cherry Leaf Shawl

Vintage Pattern Remake from Wheldon's Practical Needlework

Experience/Level of Difficulty: Intermediate

Measurements: One size fits all

Materials

3 skeins, Lion Brand "Vanna's Choice" 7oz/200gr, 340 yds/312 m. Color 099 Linen, 100% Acrylic

Size 10 straight and 29" circular needles or SIZE NEEDED TO OBTAIN GAUGE

Size 9 double pointed needles

Tapestry needle

Gauge

Note: Gauge on this project is not important. You can make this in any type of yarn just choose a needle size that works best.

Notes:

M1 – make a new stitch by lifting up the yarn between the two stitches and placing it on the needle and knitting into it

P2tog – purl 2 stitches together (decrease)
K2tog ~ knit 2 stitches together (decrease)
Sl 1, K1, PSSO – slip next stitch, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knit stitch (decrease)
Sl 1, K2tog, PSSO – slip next stitch, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over the K2tog – 2 stitches decreased
Sl 1, PU, PSSO – Slip the last stitch on the needle. With the wrong side of shawl facing up, put needle through selvedge (end) stitch and pull yarn through creating a new stitch. Pass the slipped stitch over the new stitch to attached edging to shawl

With Size 10 straight needles, cast on 3 stitches. Slip stitches as if to purl

Row 1: K3
Row 2: Sl 1, M1, K2
Row 3: Sl 1, M1, K3
Row 4: Sl 1, M1, K4
Row 5: Sl 1, M1, K5
Row 6: Sl 1, M1, K6
Row 7: Sl 1, M1, K7
Row 8: Sl 1, M1, K8
Row 9: Sl 1, M1, K9
Row 10: Sl 1, M1, K10
Row 11: Sl 1, M1, K11
Row 12: Sl 1, M1, K12
Row 13: Sl 1, M1, K6, YO, K7
Row 14: Sl 1, M1, K15
Row 15: Sl 1, K7, YO, K1, YO, K8
Row 16: Sl 1, K7, P3, K8
Row 17: Sl 1, K7, YO, K3, YO, K8
Row 18: Sl 1, K7, P5, K8
Row 19: Sl 1, K7, YO, K5, YO, K8
Row 20: Sl 1, K7, P7, K8
Row 21: Sl 1, K7, YO, K7, YO, K8
Row 22: Sl 1, K7, P9, K8
Row 23: Sl 1, K7, YO, K9, YO, K8
Row 24: Sl 1, K7, P11, K8
Row 25: Sl 1, M1, K6, YO, K1, YO, K3, P2tog, K1, P2tog, K3, YO, K1, YO, K7
Row 26: Sl 1, M1, K6, P15, K8
Row 27: Sl 1, K7, YO, K3, YO, K2, P2tog, K1, P2tog, K2, YO, K3, YO, K8
Row 28: Sl 1, K7, P17, K8
Row 29: Sl 1, K7, YO, K5, YO, K1, P2tog, K1, P2tog, K1, YO, K5, YO, K8
Row 30: Sl 1, K7, P19, K8

Row 31: Sl 1, K7, YO, K7, YO, Sl 1, K1, PSSO, K1, K2tog, YO, K7, YO, K8

Row 32: Sl 1, K7, P21, K8

Row 33: Sl 1, K7, YO, K9, YO, Sl 1, K2tog, PSSO, YO, K9, YO, K8

Row 34: Sl 1, K7, P23, K8

Continue to follow the chart below, working to desired length. Switch to size 10 circular needles when you have too many stitches for the straight needles.

Continue to follow chart until shawl is desired length. Finish as follows:

Row 1: Sl 1, K7, YO, Knit across to last 8 stitches, YO, K8.

Row 2 and all even rows: Knit

Row 3: Sl 1, K7, M1, Knit across to last 8 stitches, M1, K8

Repeat rows 2 & 3 for a total of 14 garter stitch rows. The directions are written to knit on the edging as you go (as opposed to knitting the edging separately and then sewing it on). You want a multiple of 6 + 2 selvage stitches along the edge to make sure the edging is symmetrical. You can adjust here for the number of rows needed.

Bind off.

Edging

Edging is attached to shawl as it is knitted. Slip stitches as if to knit.

With size 9 double pointed needles, CO 11 stitches

Row 1: (right side) Sl 1, K5, K2tog, YO, K3

Row 2: YO, K4, YO, K2tog, K2, YO, K2tog, Sl 1, PU, PSSO.

Row 3: Sl 1, K3, K2tog, YO, K6

Row 4: YO, K1, K2tog, YO, YO, K6, YO, K2tog, Sl 1, PU, PSSO

Row 5: Sl 1, K9, P1, K3

Row 6: K1, K2tog, YO, YO, K2tog, YO, YO, K2tog, K4, YO, K2tog, Sl1, PU, PSSO

Row 7: Sl 1, K8, P1, K2, P1, K2

Row 8: K2tog, K1, K2tog, YO, YO, k2tog, K3, YO, K2, YO, K2tog, Sl 1, PU, PSSO

Row 9: Sl 1, K5, YO, K2tog, K3, P1, K2tog, K1

Row 10: K2tog, K3, K2tog, YO, K4, YO, K2tog, Sl 1, PU, PSSO

Row 11: Sl 1, K7, YO, K2tog, K1, K2tog

Row 12: K2tog, K1, YO, K2tog, K4, YO, K2tog, Sl 1, PU, PSSO.

Repeat these 12 rows around shawl. Bind off. Weave in ends and block.
